Dear Parents/Carers

At Worsley Bridge we have a very active School Council who work with me on issues that affect our school community. This week they had a very important job, they had to interview a Lord! As you will remember from last week's newsletter I talked about Lord Wills making a visit to Worsley Bridge as part of the Parliamentary outreach programme, and on Thursday he made his way to Beckenham to find out about our children and to help us to understand his role in parliament.

In preparation for the visit the school council asked their classes what they would like to find out about working in the House of Lords and their questions were very insightful and interesting! Lord Wills explained to us what he did in the House of Lords and we even got to see where he sat when he participated in a debate!

I was incredibly impressed by the school council. They were very knowledgeable and were able to answer lots of Lord Wills' questions about the differences between the House of Lords and The House of Commons, they could even remember from Mr Bennett's assembly the colour of the seats! Elena, Brodie and Phoebe had completed some excellent research on Lord Wills and came to the meeting very well prepared. I think he was amazed that they knew his age and how many children he had!

During the hour long interview the children listened exceptionally well to the answers they were given and we particularly liked hearing about when he met the Queen. One of my favourite questions was asked by children in Reception who explained to Lord Wills that in school they earn gold or silver cards for good listening and they wondered whether Lords were awarded with anything for good listening in the House of Lords! We were pleased to hear that Lords who were good listeners often became ministers and they would be paid more than the others!

I would like to thank Miss Saltern for organising this visit! It was a fascinating afternoon and one where I felt exceptionally proud to be Headteacher at Worsley Bridge. I think we definitely have some potential politicians in the making!

Before I sign off I would also like to thank 1W for their excellent assembly this morning and congratulate Bobbi in 6W for achieving VIP status this week!


Drainage
