#### **After School Clubs**

You asked.... we listened!

I have been approached by a number of parents requesting that we consider organising an after-school child care provision at Rotherhithe.

We have been canvassing a possible agency to provide this service and we are happy that we may have found the right one.

The cost for a week's child care would be approximately £40 per week. Children could attend for between 3 and 5 days from 3;15 till 6 pm. There would need to be a firm commitment each week to pay for the child's place and the funds would not be refundable in the event of absence. To make this provision viable, I need a take up of at least 20 places to be agreed.

I have set up a link that has been texted to all parents so that you can indicate if you would be interested in a place. Once we are sure we have enough parents who are willing to pay for this service, we will organise it's opening.

#### **Spanish Day**

All children from year 3 to year 6 have weekly Spanish lessons. To celebrate all things Spanish we will be holding a special Spanish Day on **Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October**. It will be a fun packed day led by our Spanish teacher Pablo. Children are invited to wear clothes that are red, yellow and blue for a £1. All donations will be used to purchase books for the school.



#### **National Poetry Day**

Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> October is National Poetry Day. I invite you to foster a love of poetry by reading poems with your children, encouraging them to memorise poems by heart, and to compose poems at home.

At 2pm on the 4<sup>th</sup> October many KS2 classrooms will be watching a live poetry lesson delivered by the BBC. Joseph Coehlo will be performing poems during the live classroom performance.

To lead up to poetry day I will select some children to perform poems in assembly on Monday 1st October, so encourage your children to get reading.
