The children we very engaged and really enjoyed dressing up like their avatars. You can see some of the best dressed children below. Please encourage them to practise their times tables each day!




Across the school there were lots of practical math's challenges to complete during the week. Year 2 for example had fun using waffles and raisins to explore fractions.

#### Flu Vaccinations

On Thursday children across the school had their flu vaccinations. These were given by NHS nurses. The process was very quick and easy, and all children were very sensible.



If you think your child may be entitled to FSM please complete the FSM application form. You can download the form using this link: <a href="https://bit.ly/35ydYTO">https://bit.ly/35ydYTO</a> or call the school office to request a form. Once you have downloaded and filled out the form, please hand your completed application into the school office.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- > the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Registering for free meals could also raise an extra £1,320 for your child's primary school.
