COVID Update

Children from one of our families have tested positive for COVID-19 this week. As a consequence, both Fleet and Brent class have been directed to isolate. These children will not return to school until January.

The school remains open. Your child should attend school as normal.

Remote Learning - Laptops

We are pleased parents are taking up the offer of borrowing a DfE laptop when children are directed to isolate. You must return it when the isolation period comes to an end in the good condition.

COVID FAQ

My child has symptoms of COVID -19. What should I do?

If your child develops **symptoms** of COVID-19 you **MUST** book a COVID test. We can provide a test for families who are unable to get to a test center or who have attempted to arrange a home test and have been experiencing challenges.

At this point the whole household **must** self-isolate until the test results return. Siblings should **not** attend school. If the test result is **negative** then everyone can resume normal daily living. If the test result is **positive** the whole household will need to continue to self-isolate and must inform the school.

My child has been identified as a contact of someone who is positive. Who must isolate?

Only the contact person needs to isolate in this instance. This is a precaution to prevent spreading the virus. The other household members can continue normal daily living and siblings can go to school. This changes if the child then develops symptoms. At this point follow directions above.



I have previously informed you that the school can no longer afford its current staffing structure due to budget challenges. As a consequence, staff have been through a 'restructure' process. This means that 12 members of staff are being made redundant. These staff are leaving at the end of term. Most have been working at Rotherhithe for many years and we are extremely sad to see them leave. I would like to say a huge thank you to each and every one of them for making such a huge contribution to the school.

Early School Closure on Thursday 17th December



Free School Meals



Are you entitled?

If you think your child may be entitled to FSM please complete the FSM application form. You can download the form using this link: <https://bit.ly/35ydYT0> or call the school office to request a form. Once you have downloaded and filled out the form, please hand your completed application into the school office.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Registering for free meals could also raise an extra **£1,320** for your child's primary school.
