In Science, Year 6 have been looking at the many forms of fungi. Fungi takes many forms such as mushrooms, mould, and for this experiment they looked at yeast.

Yeast is a key ingredient in the art of making bread. This living organism is used to help make bread rise. Today Lea class conducted an investigation into the chemical changes that occur when you mix yeast with other substances, for example mixing it with warm water and sugar, or salt and cold water. They placed the substances in either bags or balloons.

They found that in all cases, the yeast created gas, which started to fill the bag. Yeast, sugar and warm water were the substances that led to the quickest chemical reaction.









A **chemical reaction** is a process that leads to the chemical transformation of one set of chemical substances to another.




What do you think happened to the substances that were placed in a balloon?



Amber Alert – COVID Outbreak Update

As you are aware we are currently on an **Amber alert**, due to having an outbreak of COVID in school. Thankfully lots of staff members are now returning. However, we do currently still have 4 staff members absent due to COVID. I would like to say a huge thank you to all the staff who have been flexible, hardworking and have covered others during these absensces, ensuring that we are able to remain open and provide face to face teaching for our children.

We still have high numbers of COVID amongst our year 6 children in particular. I have taken additional measures to reduce mixing with other children across the school wherever possible.

Lateral Flow Testing: Staff will continue to complete 2 weekly Lateral Flow testing. Staff and children in year 6 have also been asked to do daily lateral flow tests for another week.

Parents: I have been advised to ask parents to complete lateral flow testing on a two per week basis.

Year 2: As numbers of cases have dropped now in year 2, I am asking parents of year 2 children to complete a one off lateral flow test next week.

I will continue to monitor the number of cases and keep in touch with Public Health. I will keep you informed of any further actions if they are required.

Face Masks: Lifting of restrictions does not apply to schools when there is an outbreak. I have been required to ask staff to increase their mask wearing around the school including at drop off and collection times.

Parents should wear a **face mask** if coming on to the school site.


