**Music clubs** will resume next Friday 14<sup>th</sup> January.



## **COVID** update

Please read the updates to the school's COVID risk assessment on our website by clicking this <u>link</u>.

We recommend all parents and children complete regular **lateral flow tests** at this time. If your child tests positive for COVID using a lateral flow test they must follow the stay at home guidance. They will not be required to get a PCR test to confirm this result. However, if your child develops symptoms of COVID the advice is still to book a PCR test.
