



The Enchanted wood by Enid Blyton.



I first enjoyed this book when I was at primary school and my parents would read this book to me before bedtime. I then read this book to my children who loved it as well.

The book is about three children who move to a new house and find an enchanted wood nearby. In the wood they find the magical Faraway Tree with lots of strange but funny characters that live there. They soon discover that each time they climb up to the very top of the tree they are transported into a different land like the land of treats, the land of spells and the land of do-as-you-like! Each chapter has a new and exciting adventure.

This is the first book in the Faraway Tree series; there are three more books to enjoy with lots of adventures.






COVID Update
