We are very proud of how inclusive we are as a school. We hold Flagship status for inclusion and on Thursday we had our IQM Review. Fiona, our reviewer, really enjoyed her day, first venturing off with the early year's children to Forest School. Throughout the day she met with a number of members of staff and had a tour of the school to see some of our fantastic practice. She met with a parent to discuss the impact of the Resilient families workshop that we ran last year and also spoke to two of our wonderful children about their yoga experiences. We were very impressed by how eloquent the children were and they rightfully deserve the Head Teacher's award that you will see on the pages below.

Diversity Role Models

As part of our relationship education, we were very lucky to have Diversity workshops on Tuesday and Thursday. These workshops are fully funded by the Department for Education with the aim of teaching children to embrace difference and end bullying. The children considered different types of families and learned about the experiences of diverse role models. This included considering those with disabilities, from different cultures and different genders. They learned about the impact bullying can have on people's lives. The children were very thoughtful in their discussions and really impressed us with their skills of empathy. We were asked by some parents if children could be withdrawn from the workshops. All workshops were of course age appropriate. Relationship education is a compulsory part of the national curriculum.

Attendance Matters Double Winners:

A group of children from RPS were rewarded for their fantastic attendance all term with a trip to the Hollywood Bowling alley on Thursday 8th February.

Not only did they have a fantastic time at the bowling alley, they were also entered into a special bowling competition organised by the PESSN. 





The children have written some wanted posters to catch the dastardly pea. Who will come to the children's rescue?

Look out for the first glimpse of the contestants of 'The Masked Reader' on our website. Can you guess the member of staff behind the mask?



There are 6 elements which support a child reading for pleasure:


- 1. Being read to regularly
