### We Love Learning!

Friday is always a musical day at RPS. Learning to play a musical instrument is not only fun, but it also has cognitive benefits and is believed to help maths development. We are very fortunate to have Ana, who is our music teacher from Southwark Music services, teaching at RPS on Fridays. You can see the year 4 & 5 children really concentrate during their ukulele lessons.













Currently the **year 3** children are learning to play the Xylophone. The xylophone is a musical instrument in the percussion family that consists of wooden bars struck by mallets. Like the glockenspiel, the xylophone essentially consists of a set of tuned wooden keys arranged in the fashion of the keyboard of a piano.

It is quite clear our children love learning to make sweet music!

Diva Lamps: Children in Whale Class have been making Diva Lamps out of clay balls this week. A diva lamp is an oil lamp that is typically associated with Divali, the Hindu Festival of Lights. The word Divali means "row of lamps."

We love learning about the past at RPS and what better way to embed our knowledge than to visit Southwark Heritage Centre. **Effra** historians visited the Centre to learn all about the Ancient Egyptians.

Historians search for artefacts from the past to help them understand and piece together the lives of others. Our historians had the opportunity to touch and handle artefacts from 3000 years ago, such as: a make-up pot, a canopic jar lid and a miniature statue from an ancient tomb. They also investigated a cryptic message written in hieroglyphics and learnt that there were over 700 characters in the hieroglyphic alphabet.


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### Teacher Book Recommendations
