Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy British Science Week. It has been a truly fantastic week. The children have had so much fun while learning. They have completed a range of experiments, designed science posters, worked across year group in teams and have really developed their creative problem-solving skills. A huge thank you to Colleen our Science lead and Kealan for organizing this successful week.

**School Uniform:** Please ensure that your children are dressed in full school uniform. This includes **all black shoes**. Class teachers will contact parents if children are not wearing full school uniform.





Please be aware that the manufacturer of our **school jumpers** has increased their price to £11.

**Academy update:** The academisation process is progressing well and our target date for transfer is the 1st of April. We will update parents when the process is complete. In preparation for the transfer, we have started putting some actions into place. Parents may be asked for example, to pay for school trips before the 1st of April to ensure that money is processed correctly. If you have any questions, please ask Sharon in the office.

Being punctual is an important life skill that is required in the workplace. It is important to set these behaviour patterns when children are young. When children arrive late to school, they often miss out on important parts of their learning making it harder for them to understand what is happening in a lesson. Please ensure that your child arrives to school at 8:50 am ready to be in the classroom for 9 am. If children are late, we ask that parents please explain the reason for the lateness to staff at the school office. Additionally, if your child rides a scooter, we request parents then take these home or lock them outside of school on the bike racks available, rather than children taking them through the foyer as this is damaging the floor tiles.

Magna: we are really pleased that the new staff from Magna after school club have settled in so well at RPS. The children seem to be really engaged in activities and some children do not want to leave when they have to go home! Ad hoc day bookings for Magna are possible, but it is advisable to book these the day before you require the place as on the day booking is subject to an additional fee.

# **RPS Scientists**

For Science week, the children in year three worked on exploding the volcanoes that they created as part of their Geography homework. They talked about the different ingredients used to make the solution to simulate the lava exploding from their volcanoes. The children discussed how the vinegar reacted with the bicarbonate soda to create the eruption. Some of the volcanoes did not explode and we linked this to the importance of reliable and fair testing in science. The children's cheers when the experiment did work sounded like an eruption!









Our KS2 children split into teams of mentors to conduct experiments with teams of KS1. It was a mammoth task with lots of exciting activities going on, and the children performed fantastically! They explored colour, how sound travels and also the effects of chemical changes. Phew what a lot of brilliant scientists we have and what amazing teamwork too!


