

Dear Parents and Carers,

There has been some fantastic science learning going on in classes this week. In Whale class children have been conducting experiments to see the impact of bacteria on bread. They had some very surprising results. I am sure many of you will remember the song 'There's a hole in my bucket' and Year 2 children have been testing materials to find a way of fixing Liza's bucket. They considered which variables to keep the same and which to change in order to make it a fair test. They were extremely engaged when conducting their experiments. Year 3 have been learning about parts of flowers and dissected daffodils, while Reception children were digging and exploring the roots of plants. Year 4 & 5 have planned an investigation to find out which materials are the best thermal insulators. What fantastic learnina!

Wednesday was **World Water Day** and in assembly on Monday children considered the importance of water for our survival and comfort. They were also inspired by the story of Ryan (from Canada) who as a 6 year-old, raised £40 to build a well in Uganda. This helped children there to have access to clean water. He is the founder of the Ryan's wells foundation and is still helping people around the world today. Inspirational!

This Sunday is "Purple Day" where the whole world is asked to wear something purple to raise awareness for Epilepsy. As we are not at School on Sunday, RPS Primary has gone purple for Epilepsy Awareness today! Purple Day was founded in 2008, by another Canadian nine-year-old, Cassidy Megan. She started Purple Day in an effort to get people talking about the condition and to let those impacted by seizures know that they are not alone. She named the day Purple Day, after the internationally recognised colour for epilepsy, lavender. Thanks to parents for their generous donations and to Michelle Roberts who organized this event. Artist Marc Chagall was born into a Jewish family in the town of Vitebsk, Russia (now in Belarus) on 7 July 1887. He later moved to Paris, where he enrolled at the Académie de La Palette.

Chagall frequently used animals for symbolic purposes in his dream-like paintings that brought together aspects of French tradition with Russian folklore and Jewish motifs. Year 6 children have been exploring mixing shades of blue, red and white to create a range of purple colours to produce paintings in the style of Chagall. I can't wait to see them when they are all finished!


























Year 2 Star writing


This week, learners from Bede house and RPS have made spectacular animals and shapes out of clay and painted them with bright and also dark colours.



Favourite Book: Green Eggs and Ham by Dr Seuss






