

'Orchestrating Numeracy and the Executive'

What is the ONE project?

A programme aiming to improve early maths and thinking skills (executive functioning) in the Early Years.



Why is this project important?

It is helping us to understand how we can support the development of early maths skills and executive functions in pre-school children, ensuring they are as ready as possible for when they start school.

Our aims:

To improve early foundations of numeracy by:

- 1. Working in partnership with educators
- 2. Building executive challenge into maths learning
- 3. Providing children with learning strategies to tackle maths in the future

What does the project involve?

- 12-week programme, including 4 x 30-minute training sessions for practitioners.
- A set of 25 maths and executive function activities that you can use as part of your daily games with children aged 3-4 years.



What are executive functions?

A set of thinking skills which include being able to ignore distractions, hold information in your mind and think flexibly. These are important for maths development.

Why should you take part in the ONE?

- You are provided support, training and inspiration.
- You would be contributing to vital research.
- You'll learn some fun activities you can use anytime in your daily routine with the children, and get resources you can keep!
