They worked collaboratively to identify the variables and then selected which variable would be the independent, dependent and control in their investigation. They are eager to observe and measure the outcome over the coming days!



In Computing this week, Year 5/6 considered copyright. They discussed whether it is fair or not to use other people's intellectual work without acknowledging them or receiving permission to do so.

The children then went on to add content to a web page and use their planning from previous lessons to create a home page in Microsoft Sway. They linked this to their science learning of the '6 Kingdoms of Life'.













Digital Leaders

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

They are responsible for leading online safety developments throughout school. The Digital Leaders are here to help children learn how to stay safe online and on electronic devices. The team meet every three weeks to plan assemblies, review policies and prepare resources to share with classes based upon their needs.

They also teach younger children how to use apps on iPads such as Numbots. The younger Reception children love them coming to visit.




Favourite Book: Alex Rider Storm Breaker by Anthony Horowitz
