

Dear Parents and Carers,

Unfortunately, the cold snap of weather does not seem to have killed off the viruses. We have had a high number of absences this week with a variety of symptoms, most noticeably high temperatures. I am sure you are aware there are concerns about the spread of **measles** within the London area. Children who have received 2 doses of the MMR vaccine are highly unlikely to get measles. The children, as always gave 100% effort to achieve some fine elevation during their lessons. Their skill level is increasing week on week. Theo is very proud of them.
















In art this week, certain children from across the school were chosen to help design day as a sign for the outdoor plants. They designed letters and numbers regarding their school year.



McIntyre




Octopus Class have been enjoying books by author and illustrator Sarah McIntyre.


