


Dear Parents and Carers,

LGBTQ+ history week was introduced in assembly on Monday by Kealan, our SMSC lead. This encouraged children to recognise their similarities but acknowledge that we are all unique and that it is okay to be to be different from others. The children learned about the amazing work of Alan Turing (the father of modern computer science). They discovered that despite the fact he led a very troubled life, he was the mastermind who invented coding! Turing also cracked the Enigma code during the Second World War; a huge break through that helped the allies.





In their classes children continued to learn about other famous LGBTQ+ personalities and the contributions they have made to the world. Year 3 & 4 children learned about Bayard Rustin a political activist who stood up for civil rights, nonviolence and gay rights in America.


Evil Pea is on the loose!





- She was able to speak and negotiate maturely with peers about who was going to take the IQM bear home this week.


