

The **Relationship**, **Sex and Health Education** (**RSE**) curriculum became statutory in September 2020. Relationship and Sex Education supports and guides children and young people in lifelong learning about relationships, emotions, the human biology of sex and sexuality. It is compulsory for all primary school children to receive relationship education. At RPS we follow the Christopher Winter's Project. 
The pictures are really nice and colourful. They are my favourite colours which are gold, blue, pink and purple. They celebrate how much they love each other.


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Achievement Awards Spring 2024
