Dear Parents and Carers,

London History Day 2025: We celebrated London History Day on Friday 23rd May. In assembly on Monday, the children learned about London in the 1920s with a focus on thinking about what it would have been like to live in slum areas. The type of health care, public bathing, work and leisure activities people in the past would have engaged in. They looked at a range of photographs from the local area.



Then on Friday, children from across the school learned about the Salter family and particularly the contributions of Ada Brown (Salter). These statues of Dr Alfred Salter, his wife Ada Brown and their daughter Joyce with the family cat perched on the wall are local features designed to help us remember their contributions to Bermondsey and Rotherhithe.



The children in KS2 completed research





about the family studying pictures from the past. The children also learned about Ada Brown's activist work. She worked to improve social housing and was a pioneer campaigning against air pollution in London. She launched the Beautification Committee and pioneered the building of council houses in Wilson Grove. She was responsible for London's Park Committee and had this garden in Southwark Park dedicated to her.



The children in Key Stage 1 worked to create a piece of art to represent what they would like to have for a school garden to support nature and create peace.






Fire Brigade workshop Year 2





Explosive Art!


