Please ensure that children return to school in September wearing the correct school uniform. This includes 'all-black' shoes. Please also make sure that you write your child's name into their clothing.

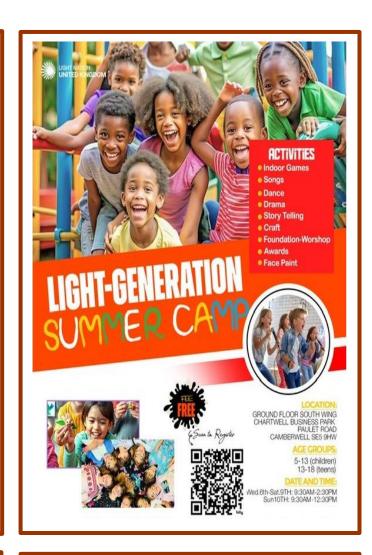
On the days, that children have PE they can dress in the **correct PE kit** for the day (white t-shirt and black tracksuit bottoms) with their school jumper or cardigan.

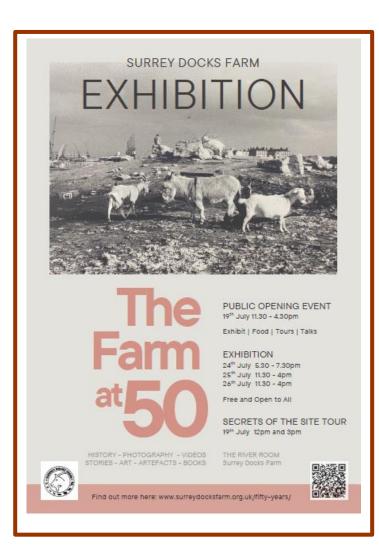

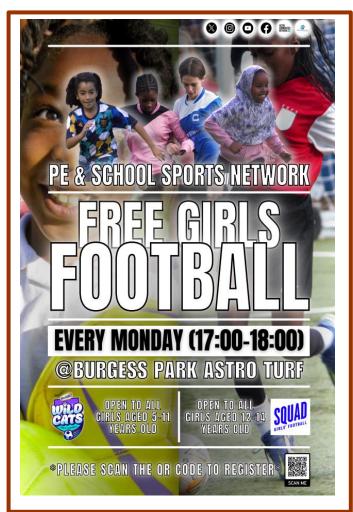

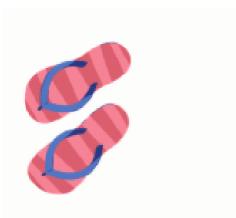
