Year 2 scientists at work!

Year 2 have been exploring how keeping clean helps us stay healthy. We learned that tiny organisms called bacteria and viruses—some of which can make us ill—are everywhere! They can spread easily through touch, especially when we don't wash our hands. We discovered how important it is to wash our hands regularly, especially before eating, to stop germs from spreading. To see the difference handwashing makes, we teamed up with Year 6 and used microscopes to look at the dirt and germs on our hands before and after washing. The results were amazing—and a little bit shocking!



Protect Our Oceans!

Year 6 have drawn inspiration from Pablo Picasso's Blue Period—an era marked by the use of sombre, monochromatic shades of blue and blue green. This artistic style resonated deeply with the students who have been exploring the theme of conservation this term. They felt that the melancholic tones of Picasso's work powerfully reflect the plight of ocean animal's suffering due to pollution, particularly from plastic waste.





















Spanish cooking- yum!

As part of our Spanish Day celebrations, Year 6 took part in a hands-on culinary session where they learned to make traditional empanadas. This engaging activity was designed to deepen their understanding of Spanish-speaking cultures through food, language, and collaborative learning. The activity also supported cross-curricular learning:

- Maths: Measuring ingredients and dividing dough equally.
- **Geography**: Mapping the origins of empanadas across the Spanish-speaking world.
- Art: Designing recipe sheets for their empanadas.
- **Science:** Identifying which food groups the ingredients are from and what nutrients they provide us.

The session concluded with students proudly sharing their empanadas and many expressed excitement about trying the recipe again at home!






















The Siri Guru Singh Sabha Gurdwara


