Dear Parents and Carers,

The children clearly enjoyed dressing up in their favourite jeans today. Thank you for your generosity.

On Monday, the children learned that 'genes' are hereditary and that a missing or faulty gene can lead to physical difference in the way babies form and then continue to grow as children. The metaphor of building a construction using Lego was considered and what could happen if a part was missing or damaged. The children watched a short film clip about an 11-year-old boy called Ashley, who has been affected by 'Treacher's Collins syndrome'. In this short film, he explained how the syndrome had prevented the formation of his ears, cheekbones and jaw which caused him to look different and the effect this has had on his speech and his hearing. He mentioned that he has had to have 30 operations to help him! Sadly, he talked about the impact of bullying he has experienced due to looking different. We need parents help! We are asking parents to cook up a storm! We would love you to donate food from your cultures to share with parents and children at RPS.

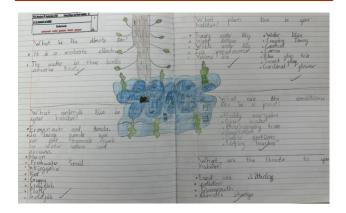
We will open doors early to parents 2:45, so that parents can come and share the party atmosphere with us.

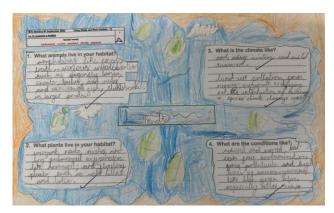

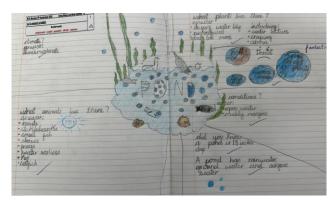


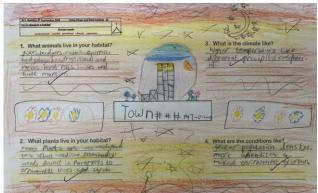


Year 6 are developing their learning about 'Living things and their habitats' by designing their own chart to classify objects according to their characteristics. This was then linked to how animals and plants are classified.

Book: What Happened to You? **Author:** James Catchpole and Karen George



Joe loves nothing better than to play pirates and fight sharks. They are far easier to manage than other children! Joe was fatigued and wary of children repeatedly asking him the same question rather than simply accepting him and allowing him to play.

'What happened to your leg? Was it a shark? A burglar? A lion? Did it fall off?'

This is a great book for discussing physical difference and how to accept people for who they are.

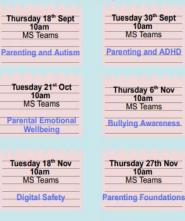

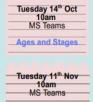
