Dear Parents and Carers.










Teaching children to care about the environment and to live sustainably is very important to RPS. All children will have an opportunity to garden and grow food that they then cook and eat during their time at RPS.

Book: I am Too Absolutely Small for School

At the start of every year, I speak to the children about how they are feeling about returning to school after the long summer holiday. After a period of change children can have a mixture of emotions from excitement to nervousness and worry. This year I used the book 'I am too absolutely small for school' to talk about these feelings.

Charlie, Lola's older brother tries to reassure her that it is important to go to school and that she will learn really useful things – like how to write a letter to Father Christmas! He persuades Lola that she cannot go to school dressed as an alligator and that she will be fine at lunch time. But he is worried when he doesn't see her in school. Is she okay?.....
