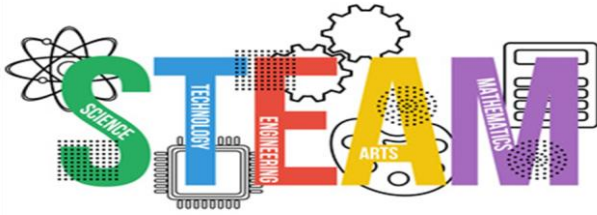

STEAM careers in the spotlight: On Monday, our science ambassadors lead the school assembly, introducing STEAM week to the school. They introduced two visitors; the first, Billy Roden, a local vet who talked to the children about the types of animals that may need treatment by a vet, ranging from domestic pets right through to livestock such as cattle and horses and even exotic animals.

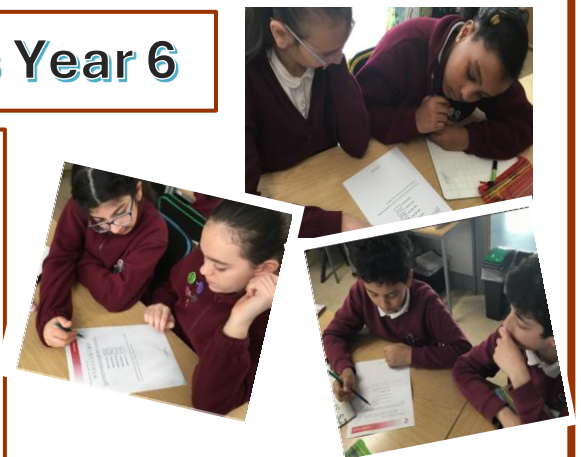
Maths Mystery Machine Stuns Year 6

Year 6 pupils engaged in a fascinating maths investigation that revealed a surprising numerical trick. The activity centred on a so-called "machine" that appeared to magically guess the correct symbol every time—much to the amazement of the class.

The challenge began with each pupil choosing any two-digit number. They then added together the digits of that number and subtracted the total from the original number. To their astonishment, the "machine" always displayed the correct symbol that represented their answer. Through careful exploration, pupils discovered the mathematical secret behind the trick:

Every possible answer is always a multiple of nine.

The activity proved to be both engaging and entertaining, giving pupils the chance to explore their oracy skills in maths in a creative and investigative way. Their enthusiasm and curiosity were evident as they worked together to uncover the hidden logic behind the machine's perfect predictions. Why don't you have a go?

Tyne class visited Rod Kitson's amazing art exhibition *Ascetic Aesthetic*. They were able to walk through a life-size apartment made from 400 individual paintings! They explored the rooms, spotted tiny details in the paintings, and talked about how art can tell a story without using any words. It was inspiring to see how many different ideas and styles Rod Kitson used to build his painted apartment and Year 2 were brilliant art detectives throughout the visit!



Year 1 Go 'Fruity' in Delicious Smoothie-Making Adventure

Year 1 pupils took their learning to a delicious new level today as they explored a colourful variety of fruits before creating their very own smoothies.

With the help of parent volunteers, the children were buzzing with excitement as plates of fruits — including bananas, pears, lemons, pineapple, and limes — were passed around for tasting. Pupils were encouraged to use their senses to describe each fruit, thinking about texture, flavour, and smell.

There were plenty of surprised reactions as children discovered new favourites. After the tasting session, pupils selected their top fruits and worked together to design their own smoothie recipes. Equipped with cups, blenders, and lots of enthusiasm, Year 1 created colourful concoctions. By the end of the session, children proudly sipped their personalised smoothie — a refreshing reward for an afternoon of learning, experimenting and fun.



Year 6 visit to Rod Kitson's local studio

Year 6 pupils from Rotherhithe Primary were treated to an inspiring artistic adventure this week following their recent STEAM careers assembly. After hearing professional artist Rod Kitson speak passionately about his creative journey, the class travelled to Surrey Quays Shopping Centre to visit his working studio and see his latest pieces up close.

Inside the studio, pupils were met with vibrant canvases, detailed sketches and works-in-progress that revealed the careful craft behind Kitson's style. The young visitors were captivated by the chance to observe how a professional artist experiments with composition, colour and detail in real time.

Kitson took time to explain his process, demonstrating how each artwork begins with careful observation—a skill Year 6 have been developing throughout their own art lessons. Pupils noted how he studies proportions, shadows and subtle details before committing anything to canvas.

One of the highlights of the visit was seeing how Kitson uses viewfinders, a tool pupils recognised instantly from their classroom practice. Kitson explained how isolating a section of a scene helps him refine focus and plan stronger compositions. Children were delighted to see that a technique they often use in school plays a key role in professional artmaking.

They also watched as Kitson sketched ideas to explore layout and scale, mirroring many of the approaches pupils have used when planning their own artwork this term. The trip strengthened the link between classroom learning and real-world practice, giving pupils a powerful example of where creativity can lead. Thank you, Rod!

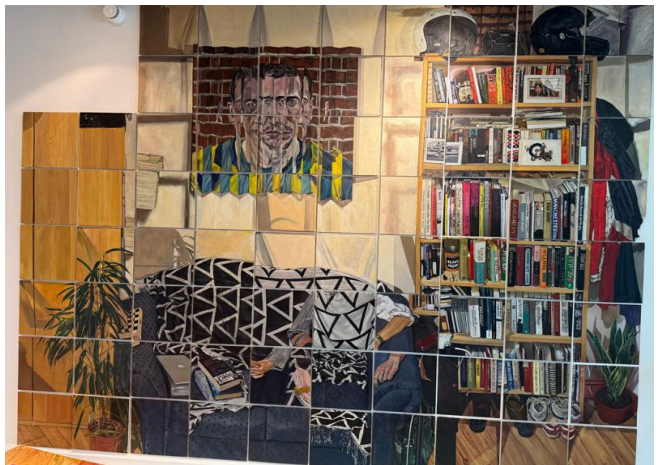

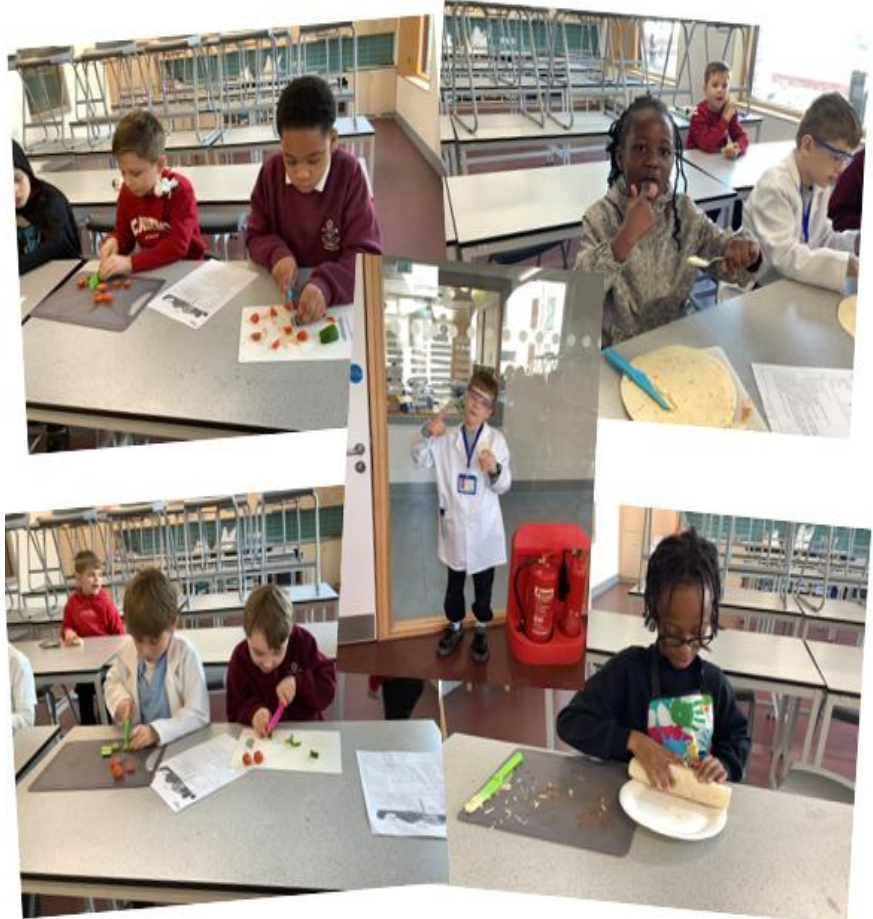


Year 2 STEAM Week fun!



As part of STEAM Week, Year 2 had an exciting opportunity to work with their fantastic Year 6 helpers to create bubble art! Using a mixture of washing-up liquid, water, and paint, the children experimented with blowing bubbles and printing the colourful patterns they made. This activity was a wonderful mix of science and art.

In DT this week, Year 2 learned about balanced diets and how different food groups help our bodies. They explored carbohydrates for energy, protein for strong muscles, and vitamins and minerals for staying healthy. The children then designed and made their own healthy wraps, choosing ingredients like cheese, hummus, tomatoes, and cucumbers. They used safe cutting skills and worked independently. Their colourful creations were healthy, neat—and delicious!



Design Technology: Cooking!



Year 6 pupils showcased their culinary creativity this week as they completed their highly anticipated 'Come Dine with Me' challenge, impressing a panel of judges made up of Science and Art Ambassadors, as well as several visiting adults. The event brought together cooking skills, sustainability awareness and thoughtful presentation—resulting in dishes that were as impressive to look at as they were to taste.

Their menus showcased a thoughtful balance of:

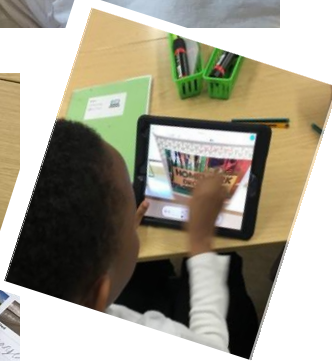
- Fresh and wholesome ingredients
- Environmentally-responsible choices, such as low-waste recipes and plant-based elements
- Creative presentation techniques inspired by their art lessons

The event proved to be a fitting finale to the project, bringing together learning from science, design technology and art in a memorable and meaningful way.

Year 6 should be incredibly proud of their achievements—they certainly rose to the challenge, delivering dishes that were as thoughtful as they were tasty.



Technology- Digital Art

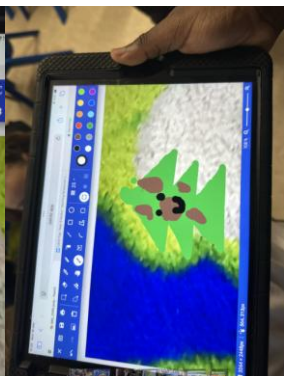
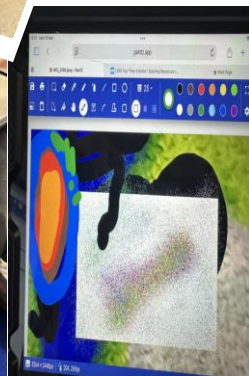
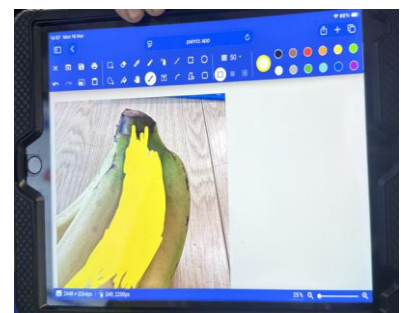
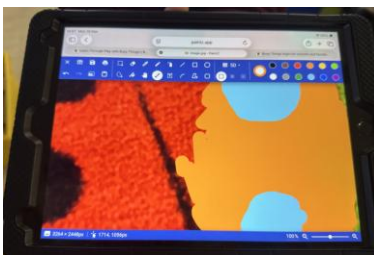


Year 4 stepped into the world of digital creativity as they learned how to edit photographs using professional-style tools. The classroom was transformed into a mini design studio as pupils experimented with cropping, rotating, and applying a range of filters to transform ordinary images into eye-catching works of art.

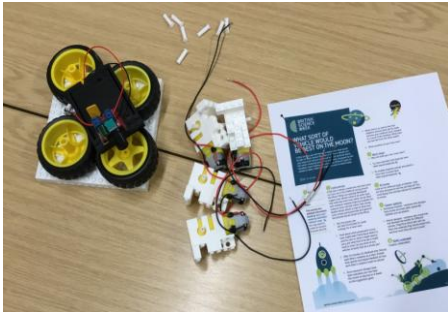
The session began with a demonstration on how to adjust a photo's composition. Pupils quickly picked up the technique of cropping, discovering how removing unnecessary background details could bring focus to the most important parts of an image. They then moved on to rotating and straightening, gaining an understanding of how small adjustments can change the mood and balance of a picture.

However, the biggest excitement came when pupils explored digital filters. From warm, vintage tones to bold, vibrant colours, Year 4 experimented enthusiastically, comparing how different effects could dramatically alter the atmosphere of a photo.

As part of STEAM Week, Year 2 explored digital photography by taking their own images using iPads and then enhancing them with a range of editing tools. The children experimented with the erase, fill, and paintbrush tools to develop and refine their images. They thoroughly enjoyed the experience.



Year 6 STEAM Spotlight: Designing the Ultimate Moon Rover!



Year 6 thoroughly enjoyed an exciting STEAM challenge, diving into the world of space exploration with the guiding question:

“What sort of vehicle would be best on the Moon?”

To tackle this, pupils explored how science, technology, engineering and maths come together when designing machines for extreme environments. Their mission: design a lunar rover capable of travelling across the Moon's dusty, rocky surface.

What the children considered:

Wheel Design

Pupils discussed how wheels behave on different surfaces and experimented with ideas such as:

- Wide wheels for stability on uneven ground
- Treaded or ridged wheels to prevent slipping on lunar dust
- Lightweight structures to reduce energy use

Materials

They explored which materials would be strong enough to survive harsh lunar conditions while remaining light enough to move easily. Many groups selected materials that were:

- Durable for rocky terrain
- Heat-resistant to cope with extreme temperatures
- Lightweight to conserve energy in low gravity

Creative Engineering

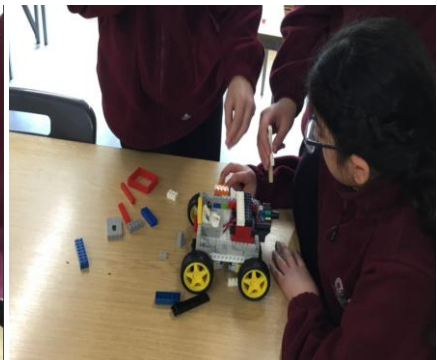
Working in teams, Year 6 sketched designs, discussed features such as suspension, solar panels, and protective shells, and justified their engineering decisions. Their ideas showed fantastic imagination and thoughtful problem-solving.

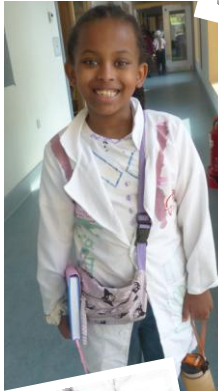

I'd like to say a huge thank you and well done to our families for your creativity!



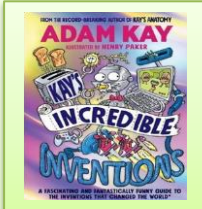

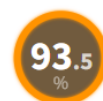
