Spanish Day 2026

On Friday, we marked our Spanish Day 2026. We certainly, had temperatures akin to Spain's! On Wednesday, John (our Spanish lead) delivered a whole school assembly introducing the theme of the day: **"Flags of the Spanish-Speaking World."** Throughout the day, children learned about Spanish-speaking countries and explored flags through a range of creative and cross-curricular activities. They practised saying colours in Spanish through fun games and activities. The children also explored Spanish culture, geography and the history of Spanish-speaking countries. They were then invited to dress up in Spanish colours on Friday.

Well done to all pupils for their enthusiasm and creativity throughout the day!



Year 6 pupils enjoyed a fantastic cooking activity where they made traditional Spanish Magdalenas (Spanish muffins). Before they began baking, the children practised their Spanish language skills by requesting ingredients and equipment in Spanish. They confidently used key vocabulary and phrases to ask for the items they needed, bringing their classroom learning to life in a practical and engaging way.

Working together in teams, the pupils carefully measured ingredients, followed instructions and supported one another throughout the baking process. The activity encouraged collaboration, communication and problem-solving, while also providing an insight into Spanish culture and cuisine.

The delicious Magdalenas were a great success, and the children were proud to enjoy the treats they had worked so hard to make. Well done, Year 6, for demonstrating excellent teamwork and enthusiasm while celebrating Spanish language and culture!

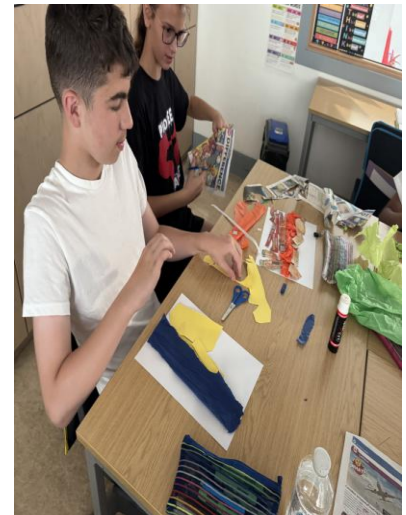


Flags of the Spanish-Speaking World



As part of our exciting Spanish Day celebrations, Year 6 pupils explored the cultures of Spanish-speaking countries through a creative mixed-media art project. The children researched different countries and then designed and created vibrant flags using a variety of materials, including paint, coloured paper, tissue paper, fabric and collage techniques.

The project encouraged pupils to develop their artistic skills while deepening their understanding of the Spanish-speaking world. The finished flags were full of colour, creativity and attention to detail, showcasing the children's enthusiasm and hard work.



Year 6 Geography Fieldwork Project with British Land

"Is our neighbourhood a happy place?" was the enquiry question that Year 6 set out to investigate as part of an exciting three-session project with British Land.

The project began with a workshop in school, where the children learnt about the Canada Water Masterplan, one of the largest regeneration projects currently taking place in London. They explored how urban development can affect the lives of local residents and considered what makes a community a happy and successful place to live.

The children then travelled to Canada Water to carry out their own geographical fieldwork. Working in groups, they interviewed members of the public, using a range of question types including open-ended, multiple-choice, binary and scale questions. Their surveys focused on six key themes: our homes, nature and parks, play and fun, gathering places, getting around, and working and creating.

Following their fieldwork, the children visited Dock Shed, where they analysed their survey responses and began preparing presentations to share their findings. They carefully considered the views of local people and started to draw conclusions about how happy the neighbourhood is and what could make it even better.

Throughout the project, the children represented the school exceptionally well. Members of the public and the British Land organisers were highly complementary about the children's focus, confidence and excellent manners during the sessions.

The next stage of the project will see Year 6 presenting their findings and recommendations to VIPs from British Land. We wish them the very best as they prepare to share their important work and demonstrate the valuable insights they have gained through this real-world investigation.



Science Club – Investigating Chemical Reactions

Science Club was full of excitement this week as our Year 6 leaders helped Year 2 pupils learn about chemical reactions and why they are important in everyday life, particularly in cooking.

The session began with discussions about how to identify when a chemical reaction has taken place. The children learned to look for signs such as gases being produced, changes in texture and changes that cannot easily be reversed.

To put their learning into practice, the children carried out a tasty investigation by testing two biscuit recipes. One recipe contained bicarbonate of soda, while the other did not. Before baking, the children made predictions about what they thought would happen and discussed the role of bicarbonate of soda in baking.

Once the biscuits were cooked, the children carefully compared the results. They observed differences in the texture, appearance and size of the biscuits and discovered how the chemical reaction caused by the bicarbonate of soda affected the final product. This helped them understand why certain ingredients are important in cooking and baking.

The Year 6 leaders did a fantastic job of explaining scientific ideas and supporting the younger children throughout the investigation. Meanwhile, the Year 2 pupils demonstrated great curiosity and enthusiasm, asking thoughtful questions and making careful observations.

It was a fun and engaging session that combined scientific enquiry with a delicious real-life application of chemistry.

Science Club – Can You Lift Ice with a String?

Science Club was full of curiosity and teamwork this week as our Year 6 leaders guided Year 2 pupils through a fascinating chemistry investigation: can you lift an ice cube using only a piece of string?

The children began by making predictions and discussing what they thought might happen. They then placed a piece of string across an ice cube and sprinkled a small amount of salt over the top. After waiting patiently for a short time, they carefully lifted the string and were amazed to see the ice cube rise with it!


Through the investigation, the children learnt that the salt briefly melts the surface of the ice. As the water refreezes around the string, it becomes trapped, allowing the ice cube to be lifted. This introduced the children to the idea that materials can change state and that chemistry plays a part in many everyday phenomena.

It was a fun and engaging session that brought science to life, while providing another excellent opportunity for Year 6 pupils to demonstrate their leadership skills and support younger learners.

Learning About Sustainable Energy



KS2 pupils recently took part in an engaging workshop led by presenters from the Diverse Heat Network. The session provided an excellent opportunity for children to build on their learning in both Geography and Science while exploring the important topic of sustainable energy.

The workshop began with a discussion about different sources of energy and the efficiency of various energy systems. Pupils learnt about renewable and non-renewable energy sources and considered why finding more sustainable ways to heat our homes and buildings is important for the future of our planet.

The presenters then introduced the concept of a district heat network, explaining how thermal energy can be generated centrally and distributed efficiently to multiple buildings. The children were fascinated to learn how this approach can reduce energy waste and help lower environmental impact.

To reinforce their understanding, pupils worked collaboratively to create models demonstrating how thermal energy is transferred through a heat network. This hands-on activity helped bring the science to life and encouraged the children to think about real-world solutions to environmental challenges.

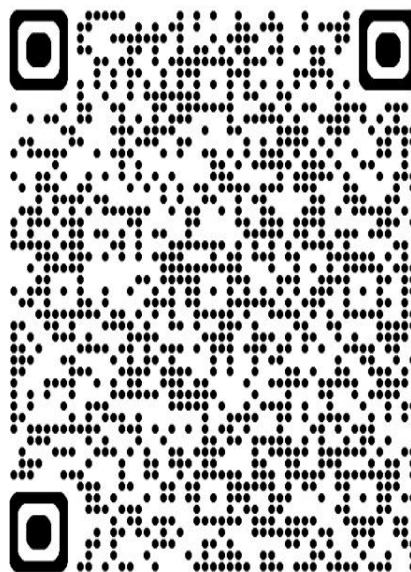
