[Proposed Additional Specialist Resourced Classes](#)

Both RPS and Grove Primary School have been selected to host additional specialist resource classes for children with special educational needs. The proposed opening date is September 2026. The opening will begin with three classes for twenty-four pupils who have Education Health and Care plans (EHCPs). The provision will then expand gradually, reaching six classes, during the academic year 2027–2028. Admissions to the Rotherhithe Specialist Resource Hub will be coordinated by the Southwark SEND Team, working in partnership with Nexus Education Schools Trust (NEST). This will require some adjustments to the school and allotment area of the playground. The consultation period during which parents are able to ask questions or make comments, is now live on NEST's website. Follow this link to find out more information:

NATIONAL POTRAIT GALLERY

On a rainy and wet day, our class went on a trip to the National Portrait gallery where we saw paintings drawings and photographs! We found out that portraits are not just random photos or pictures, but they can tell a deep story behind the picture.

When we arrived, we talked about different pictures and migration stories that were remarkably interesting and fascinating. We learned that there are clues in the stories of other people's lives. We looked at some famous portraits like John Blanke and Catherine of Aragon from the Westminster roll. I enjoyed learning about John Blanke because he was a Jamaican trumpeter in the Tudor times which shows that there were diverse cultures living in England at that time. We also learnt about Judith Kerr, who was an author with many famous books like 'The Tiger who came to tea' and 'When Hitler Stole Pink Rabbit', which we have read last term. As well as Judith Kerr, we also learnt about Stormzy, who is Nigerian and his portrait shows modern British culture.

After, we went and looked at different types of portraits, and we examined the portraits and the clothes and colours also the objects the subjects were holding. We also explored different questions about each portrait.

We had an amazing time there and we discovered lots of new information. It was also fun guessing what their lives might have been like.

Central School of Ballet Art Workshop

Year 6 recently had an exciting and creative workshop delivered by The Central School of Ballet. The session gave pupils a fascinating insight into the world of ballet and stage performance.

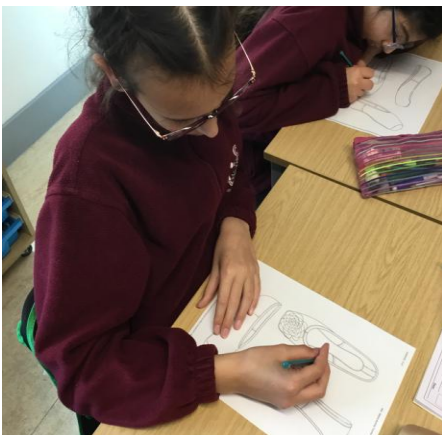
During the workshop, pupils learned about *Freed of London*, a famous pointe shoe company founded in 1929. They discovered how these specialist shoes are carefully handmade and have been worn by many professional dancers on stages around the world.

The children also explored the history of pointe shoes, learning how they have developed over time to support dancers in performing complex and graceful movements. This gave them a real understanding of the skill, strength, and precision required in ballet.

The highlight of the workshop was a hands-on creative task. Pupils were challenged to design their own pointe shoe, fit for the stage. They were encouraged to be as bold and imaginative as possible, using colours, patterns, and decorative ideas to create something unique and eye-catching. The results were fantastic, with a wide range of creative designs reflecting each pupil's individuality.

Overall, the workshop was an inspiring experience that combined history, creativity, and performing arts. Year 6 thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity and produced some truly beautiful and imaginative designs.

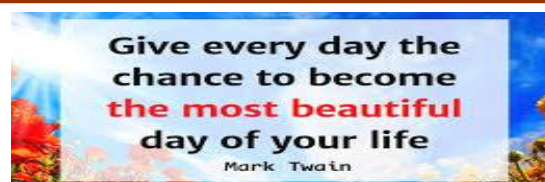
Please help us to improve our school attendance. Currently we fall below national expectations for attendance- 96%.
