Dear Parents and Carers,

We have finally reached the penultimate week of term and despite the ongoing heat, it has been a busy one. We have had lots of trips, visitors and our Year 6 prom, and we are not finished yet! Next Tuesday, is the final class assembly of the year with **Whale Class** stepping up to perform. We have our achievement awards on Monday, Attendance parties on Tuesday and we finish on Wednesday 22nd July with the **Year 6 graduation and farewell at 11 am**.

I am sure there will be a few tears! On Wednesday, Year 6 pupils should come dressed in school uniform for the final time, with a shirt that they can have signed. Once the graduation is over, parents can take Year 6 pupils only home. Children cannot travel independently at this time; they must have an adult collect them in order to be permitted to leave early.



For the rest of the school, we will be holding our final end-of-term **class parties** on Wednesday afternoon. Children can dress in sensible party clothes. Please ensure footwear is appropriate. London Zoo

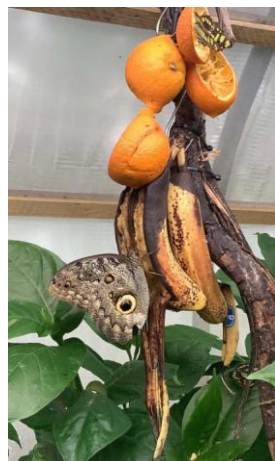


To deepen Year 3's knowledge about animal conservation, they visited the London Zoo on Friday. The children have been finding out how deforestation is affecting orangutans and why it is so important to protect their natural habitats. The children were very lucky to be given a special tour of the spider monkey enclosure, where they met the zoo's newest arrival, a baby spider monkey that was just two days old. The children loved seeing such a young animal and learning about how the zoo cares for endangered species.

During the day, they explored a wide variety of enclosures and enjoyed watching the playful penguins and giant butterflies.

The children have also been learning about the Portia spider. Portia spiders are renowned for being the world's most intelligent spider because they modify their hunting strategies and learn from situations as it encounters them. The children got to see live Portia spiders and were fascinated. They showed bravery while walking through the spider cave, I think that may also be that the adults!

It was a wonderful day that the children will remember for a long time and they returned to school with a greater appreciation of the importance of looking after animals and the world we live in.



Year 6 Prom

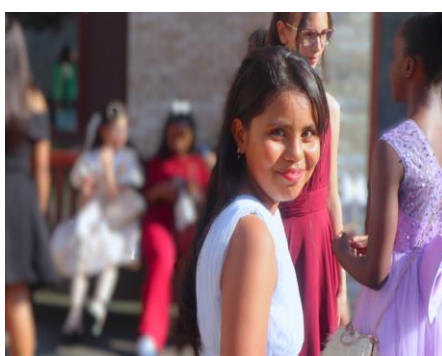
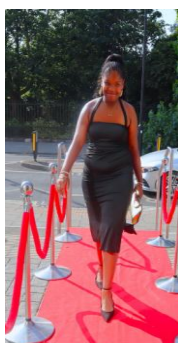

Eden's Class Assembly

The Great Fire of London



Eden Class performed their class assembly based on the book *Vlad and the Great Fire of London*. The children explored and acted out how the Great Fire of London began in the bakery on Pudding Lane. They showed how the fire spread quickly across the city and how people escaped to safety on boats. The children then explained how the Mayor helped to manage the situation and how London was rebuilt after the fire. They also shared the important lessons that were learned, including the need for safer building materials and better planning to prevent such disasters in the future.



Musical Mayhem Workshops



On Wednesday and Friday, all classes across the school were treated to a musical workshop delivered by 'Musical Mayhem'. The children really enjoyed it. Each session was a combination of acting, singing and dancing.

Year 6 learned a mini dance and split into two groups to hold a 'dance-off'. Next, they played acting games. All the children were given a role to play. The winner was the best impersonator.

They also learned the bridge and chorus to Sara Bareilles' song *Brave*, which encouraged them to challenge themselves and embrace their nerves. The facilitators explained how acting, dancing and singing could help them to be a 'brave person', even if they felt shy, quiet or worried.

They sang call-and-response songs in different types of voices (giants and babies, for example). The children were still singing these songs to each other for the rest of the week! A huge thank you to the Musical Mayhem team for providing these wonderful experiences for the children.

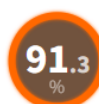

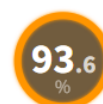

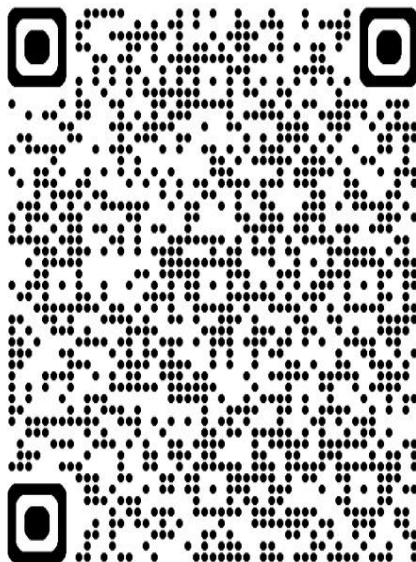
