Whale Class's Science Assembly



On Tuesday, parents and Key Stage 1 children were treated to an assembly delivered by Whale Class. The children shared their science learning across the term, focussing on all things nature. They explained the different seasons and looked at what happens to the leaves if a tree is deciduous or evergreen.



They explained that foods that grow seeds such as strawberries and bananas, are fruits, whereas rocket is a vegetable. They also looked at bubbles and explored what shape a bubble would be when using different-shaped bubble wands. They discovered it was always a sphere. What a lot of learning! 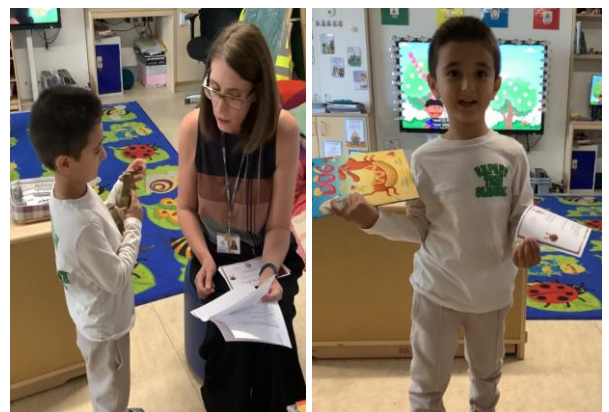

The Rose Vouchers Project gives vouchers to buy fresh fruit and vegetables from local markets and some other places. If eligible, you will receive at least £4 of vouchers every week.

Who is it for?

If you live in Southwark and have children under 5*, or are more than 10 weeks pregnant, you may be able to get Rose Vouchers if one of the following applies:

- You receive Healthy Start
- You have a low or no household income (less than £408 income a month if you are on Universal Credit)
- You have no recourse to public funds (NRPF)

* Children must be under 5 until 31st August

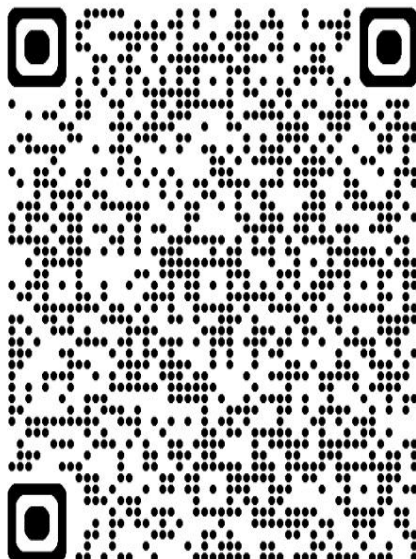
