What a busy week it has been! Lots of school trips, performances and even a tennis taster workshop for our classes, but the highlights this week have been the children's own performances.

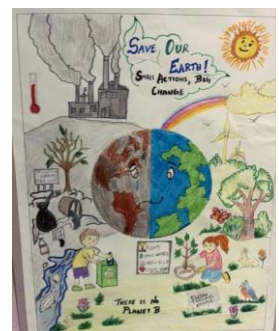
Sports Mornings

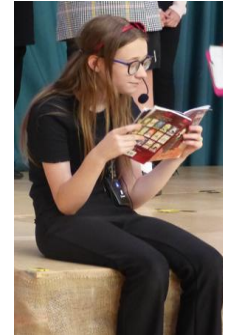
Environmental Awareness Competition

Inspired by the Central School of Ballet

Year 3 had a wonderful opportunity to visit the Central School of Ballet, where they enjoyed an inspiring afternoon exploring the world of dance and costume design. The visit began with an incredible **Dance Showcase** performed by students from the Central School of Ballet. The children were captivated by the variety of performances, which included **ballet, contemporary dance and jazz**, and were amazed by the skill, creativity and athleticism on display.

Following the performance, the children took part in an engaging **Dance Workshop**, where they explored some of the themes and ideas from the pieces they had watched. Through movement and teamwork, the children followed choreography.

The afternoon concluded with a **Costume Workshop** led by the Head of Wardrobe. The children took part in a fun **wardrobe scrap challenge**, working in teams to design and create a costume for a character from a story they had read. The children demonstrated fantastic creativity, collaboration and problem-solving skills as they brought their ideas to life.

It was a memorable and enriching experience, and we are incredibly proud of how enthusiastically Year 3 participated throughout the day. The trip was a wonderful way to inspire creativity and introduce the children to the many different aspects of the performing arts.



Year 3 Science Investigation

Which substance is most effective at cleaning dirty coins?"

This week, Year 3 became scientists as they carried out a fascinating enquiry based on the question: "Which substance is most effective at cleaning dirty coins?"

The children were given a range of everyday substances to test, including both acidic substances such as lemon juice, vinegar and fizzy drinks, and alkaline substances such as toothpaste and soapy water.

Before starting the investigation, the children made predictions about which substance would clean the coins most effectively and which would be the least effective. They also discussed which substances they thought were acidic or alkaline and considered whether this might affect the cleaning results.

Working scientifically, the children carefully observed the condition of the coins before and after testing each substance. They recorded their findings and compared the effectiveness of each cleaning solution.

The investigation sparked lots of discussion, with pupils making links between their results and the properties of different substances. Year 3 demonstrated excellent scientific skills by making predictions, carrying out fair tests, observing changes and drawing conclusions from their results.

A fantastic afternoon of scientific discovery was enjoyed by all!



Year 5 and 6 Discovery Day at the National Maritime Museum



Year 5 and Year 6 had an unforgettable experience during their recent Discovery Day at the National Maritime Museum.

The day was packed with exciting, curriculum-linked activities centred around the theme of space. Pupils took part in two engaging workshops which combined multi-sensory activities and storytelling, helping them to deepen their understanding of scientific concepts in a fun and interactive way.

One of the highlights of the visit was the live Science Theatre Show, which brought the KS2 science curriculum to life. The children were captivated by the demonstrations and investigations, which encouraged curiosity, questioning and a sense of wonder about the world around them.

The pupils also had the opportunity to visit the new *Astronomers Take Over* exhibition and enjoy an amazing planetarium show. They were fascinated by the discoveries of astronomers and learned more about space, stars and our place in the universe.

The trip was both educational and inspiring, providing memorable experiences that enriched the children's learning beyond the classroom. We were incredibly proud of the excellent behaviour, enthusiasm and engagement shown by all pupils throughout the day. Well done, Year 5 and Year 6, for making the most of this fantastic opportunity!

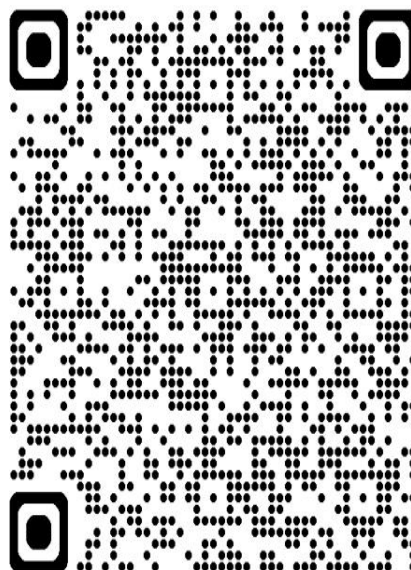
